



UCI Hoopsters End Phase 1 of Road Trip

The Anteaters dropped opener but even playing before a hometown opening night crowd of 18,700, fourth ranked Minnesota raced to a 24 point half-time bulge, then withstood a second half UCI rally to defeat the Anteaters 93-71 Saturday night in Minneapolis.

Getting a 21 point performance from junior guard Harlan Peet, Irvine fell behind 47-23 at the half, but came back to score 10 straight points midway through the second period to pull within 14 points (76-62) with eight minutes to play.

Anteater Coach Tim Tift expressed satisfaction with his team's second half effort in which Irvine outscored Minnesota, 48-46.

"They tried to bury us, but we came back," said Tift. "I think we outplayed them in the second half."

For the game UCI shot 51% from the field (24 for 47) and 72% from the charity stripe (23 for 32). They lost the re-

bound battle to the taller Gophers, 48-37.

Scoring for UCI was Baker with 11, Magnuson, 8; Newton, 10; Maras, 8; Barr, 7; Peet, 21; Clark, 4; Bunch, 2.

UCI Tops North Dakota State to Square Record

With Scott Magnuson and Dave Baker controlling the boards, UCI pulled away from North Dakota State in the second half and scored an impressive 62-56 intersectional victory on the road at Fargo, North Dakota Monday night.

Grabbing the lead at 12-11 with 13:39 to go in the first half, the Anteaters were never behind again and raced to a 32-21 half-time bulge. They raised their margin to as many as 15 points several times in the second half. The closest North Dakota could get was four points 56-52 with 4:30 to play. But sophomore forward Jerry Maras scored a three point play and the Bisons never threatened again.

Anteater guard Don Newton lead the scoring with 16 points, he was followed by Maras with

13, Magnuson with 11, Baker had 9 and Peet 6, coming off the bench to score 5 points was Rich Mraule.

The game was won on the boards though, as Magnuson grabbed 17 caroms and Baker 13 as UCI compiled a whop-

ping 47-28 rebounding margin.

Anteater Coach Tim Tift was delighted with the victory. "We owned the defensive boards and gave them no second shots," he said. "The rebounding and defense did it

for us. "We're getting better each time we play." UCI is now 1-1 in the young season.

The Anteaters now prepare to meet nationally ranked University of Hawaii, Friday and Saturday in Honolulu.

The Irvine intercollegiate sailing team, coached by Richard Sweet, squeezed out UC Berkeley to win the All Cal Regatta, Friday and Saturday in San Diego. Irvine's Bob Cole, with crew John Billings, placed low-point "B" skipper clinching the regatta with comfortable wins in the last races. Jeff McDermaid with crews Larry Jacobson and Tom Blanton placed second in the "A" division behind San Diego's Gary Lee.

Coming into the 13th race, the "B" teams' final races, Berkeley held a solid first place with Irvine second and San Diego close behind in third. The Berkeley boat, barging at the start, fouled Bob Cole and was later disqualified from that race. In the last race, Berkeley was pushed father back by finishing third behind Santa Cruz and Irvine.

The final scores were UCI with 34 points, UCSD with 37, and Berkeley in third with 38. Other schools sailing included UCLA, Riverside, Santa Barbara and Santa Cruz.

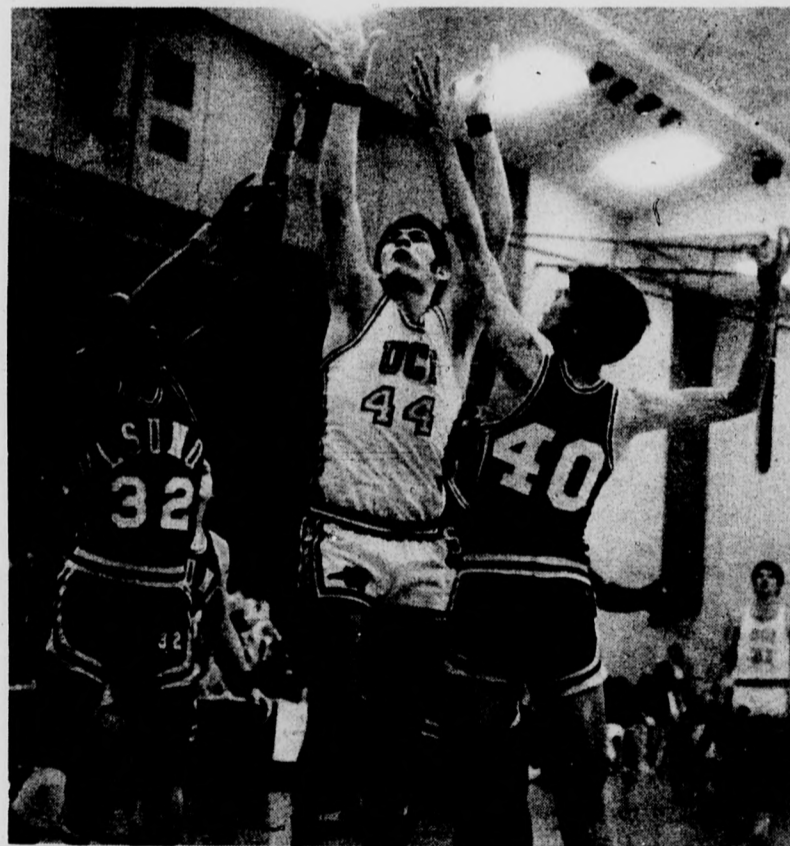
